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WHO ARE WE?

CEMÉA Picardie is first and foremost a regional association with a multi-faceted identity:

- new education movement,
- popular education association,
- professional training organisation,
- a social economy company,
- a space for experimentation and research.

Working in the fields of education, social action, culture and entertainment.

CEMÉA Picardie is recognised nationally as being of public utility, and is the bearer of solid collective experience: the association is part of a network of CEMÉAs in France and internationally, supported by a national association, a network that has kept the new education movement alive for 80 years.

The starting point for its actions is the meeting of people, ideas and projects, working together to create, innovate and promote new ideas.

In Picardy's region, CEMÉA activities bring together volunteers, employees, trainees and associated organisations, who are present in many towns in the region to share and pass on their social and societal commitment. Ceméa de Picardie also has an intercultural group that meets regularly to discuss project development, mobility support and interculturality.

We are a place for ongoing educational research to propose, experiment with and develop relevant social interventions, and to enable each individual to become involved and form part of society.







INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY FOR PROFESSIONALS AND LEARNERS

Every year since 2018, the CEMEAs of Picardie have offered trainees in vocational animation the opportunity to take part in a mobility as part of their training pathway, with the support of the Erasmus + agency particularly aimed at trainees in vocational animation:

- BPJEPS ANIMATION SOCIALE (for vulnerable groups)
- BPJEPS LOISIRS TOUT PUBLIC (for minors).

Several of our trainees have benefited from the Erasmus programme by going to KASA- PT in Lisbon or CLUBE Intercultural Europeu in Lisbon, or klub kultury "przegorzały" in Krakow. This is a short stay of 14 days, with a group of around fifteen people supervised by a trainer.

Our international projects

As part of our voluntary activities:

• For the BAFA (Brevet d'Aptitude aux Fonctions d'Animateur is a diploma that allows you to become a leader in holiday camps abroad): We are currently able to offer our trainees three destinations: Morocco, Ireland and the Czech Republic.

As part of our actions financed by Erasmus +:

- Erasmus Key Action 1: learner mobility and youth exchanges.
- With the OFAJ (Office franco-allemand pour la jeunesse): Tandem language stay

1.1. Objectives:

- understand the environment in which are situent the structures and formalise the observation with a study of the environment
- discover a new language through language activities
- observe the general operation of the structures and present it to the group of trainees
- taking part in the life of the public at the facility
- design, implement and evaluate an activity take part in end- of-day and end-of-mobility reviews
- collectively manage daily life in the accommodation facility

2. Skills to be developed:

- Intercultural skills: Discovering a culture, working on mental representations; Being able to understand the environment in which the structures are located and formalise the observation through a study of the environment; Discovering the practice of a new language through language activities.
- Professional skills: communicating in professional situations; taking into account the characteristics of the public in their environment; being able to work as part of a team, being able to share time in daily life; being able to welcome the public.
- Mobility skills: Being able to get around; Developing independence

THE PARTNER'S ROLE

We hope to be able to work together on welcome and sending p r o j e c t s inspired by the new education.

This is what we expect from our partner:

- help in finding accommodation in the host country
- help in obtaining transport cards for local travel (if necessary)
- support for work placements (discovery of culture and professional practices)
- search for immersion sites in animation structures

We allocate a sum of €150 per trainee in our budget to the partner organisation organising the mobility.

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


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


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
